# Ngahinapouri School Agricultural Day and Flower Show

# Wednesday 16th October

## At Home Activities

Students choose <u>two only</u> of the following activities to complete at <u>home, and</u> bring in for judging. These activities are open to <u>all</u> children, <u>including</u> those competing in Agriculture Day, if they wish. Only <u>one baking</u> <u>option</u> may be chosen, along with <u>one other craft activity option</u>, or if students do not wish to bake, they may choose two craft activities.

Model Farm  Animal sculpture	It can be reassembled at school or brought already assembled. Display-Hall  Made at home. Display- Hall	Farms that use mostly natural materials do better in this section. The farm can be made in a roasting dish or similar vessel. Use materials like, dirt, sawdust, sticks, moss, wood, grass etc Each model will need to have the child's name and year level on a piece of paper under it on the day.  This is a good holiday project. Make your animal out of Paper Mache, recycled materials, card, wood, metal etc  Each sculpture will need to have the child's name and year level on a piece of paper under it on the day.
Photography	There are three categories, junior (Year 1-3), middle (Year 4-6) and senior (Year 7-8). Each photo needs to be named on the back with a caption under the photo. The maximum size of the photo is A5 (15 X 21cm) but it can be smaller.  Display- Hall	The theme for the photo competition is "Our School Values in the wild". The child section of the photography is about
Muffins	Made at home. Displayed in the Hall	Only 3 on a plate please and not iced. Childs age on a piece of paper with their name on underside of paper, placed underneath the plate
Cupcakes	Made at home. Displayed in the Hall	Only 3 on a plate please and must be decorated. Childs age on a piece of paper with their name on underside of paper placed underneath the plate.
Cake decorating	Made at home. Displayed in the Hall.	Childs age on a piece of paper with their name on underside of paper, placed underneath the plate.

## AG DAY / FLOWER SHOW AND GROUP DAY

#### In-School Activities

Students must <u>bring the items in bold from home</u> on Flower Show morning. <u>All four activities</u> are strictly to be done on the day at school, **NOT** to be bought to school complete. Children competing in Agriculture Day will **NOT** be doing the in-class activities.

In-school activities	Items required	Suggestions
Flower arrangement in an unusual container	Selection of flowers     An unusual container	Be creative with your choice of container. Vary the height of your flowers and use a mixture of foliage and flowers.
Vaseline Saucer	Saucer (named underneath)     Selection of flowers (Vaseline will be supplied)	Aim to cover as much of the saucer as possible with flowers, petals, leaves or a combination. Patterns and symmetry are often most pleasing to the eye.
Natural pet craft	A selection of found objects to make a pet creation (eg. Pinecones, driftwood, shells, feathers, seeds etc.     Optional: Other scraps/bits and pieces to make your pet interesting. (eg. Felt/fabric scraps, recycled buttons, plain/soloured card, googly eyes etc)	Get collecting over the holidays. Try out some ideas beforehand. Take a look on Pinterest for inspiration. Try to use as many natural objects as possible, and use recycled items if you can.
Rock art	An interesting shaped rock (reasonably smooth is best)	Find an interesting rock to paint on over the holidays. A porous rock like pumice will not take the paint well, so smooth is best.




