GAGA BALL RULES



- All players start with their hand touching the wall of the pit.
- The game begins when the referee thows the ball into the pit.
- All players shout "GA!" for the first two bounces then "GO!" for the final bounce. "GA GA GO!"
- Once the ball is in play, any player can hit the ball with one hand.
- If a player is hit by the ball below the knee they are out and must leave the pit.
- If a player hits the ball out of the pit they are out and must leave the pit.
- The last player in the pit wins

Then everyone can jump in for the next round!

- Players cannot catch, double touch or hold the ball.
- If you hit the ball against the wall you can hit it again.

PROBLEM SOLVING

- The referee' decision is final.
- Play with honesty and integrity.
- If you are playing without a referee and have a disagreement, you may solve the problem by:
 - rock, paper, scissors
 - restart
 - ask a senior student or duty teacher to help
 - play something different








